

**WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT  
ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS NOTE (September, 2017)**

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The Department of Women and Child Development Department Haryana, was the part of Social Welfare Department earlier. It came to existence on 01.04.1992. During the year 1992-93, the total budget of the Department was Rs. 29.41 crore which has been increased to Rs. 1247.25 crore during the year 2017-18. Total expenditure of this year upto the month of September is 386.04 crore.

The State Govt. is committed for the empowerment of women so that they may live with dignity in an environment free from violence and discrimination and can contribute equally in the development process of the society to promote social and economic empowerment of women through policies and programmes, main streaming of gender concerns and creating awareness about their rights, in order to enable them to realize their full potential.

Children are the future of our Society. Well nurtured and healthy children, with full opportunity for growth and development in a safe and protective environment to make a healthy Nation. The main aim / objective of the department is to promote social and economic empowerment of women through policies / programmes, spreading awareness about the children's rights and facilitating their access to learning, nutrition, institution supports etc. is a top priority of the department.

**Initiatives undertaken by the Department**

**1. Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao Programme**

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Programme was launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 22.01.2015 at Panipat with the objective to prevent gender biased sex selective elimination, ensure survival, education & empowerment of the girl child. The efforts made by the State Government have shown encouraging results and become a role model for others. Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh invited Haryana Govt. for showing success story and motivate their officers. The sex ratio at birth in Haryana which was 830 as per 2011 census has gone upto 909 in August, 2017. The State was awarded Nari Shakti Puraskar at Rashtrapati Bhawan on 08.03.2016 by the Union Government in recognition of our success in improving female sex ratio at birth. Yamunanagar district has been conferred the honor for exemplary performance in the field of Girl Education on the National Girl Child Day on 24.01.2017 by the Govt. of India.

Following initiatives have also been undertaken by State Govt. under the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Programme:-

**(i) Legal Action**

State Government has initiated a campaign to control and check violation of PNDT Act and MTP Act. Chief Medical Officers, in liaison with Deputy Commissioners, are conducting raids and inspecting all ultrasound machines of their respective districts. Decoy customers are being sent to find out the use of unauthorized mobile ultrasound machines and sex predetermination kits. A special legal expert has been appointed at CM Secretariat to follow up each individual case of violation of PNDT and MTP Act to ensure conviction. Till now 503 FIRs have been registered under this Act.

**(ii) Social Activism**

The State Government has taken various steps to bring all communities, social organizations & non-government organization on a common platform for successful implementation of the programme. The activities performed up to August, 2017 are given as under:-

10. 110727 Health Camps /Baby Shows were organized.
11. Logo of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao displayed on all the Government and many private school buildings.
12. Wide publicity of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao has also been made through Haryana Transport Buses by displaying the logo.
13. Orientation Programmes on BBBP for Doctors, PRI members, NGOs, Sakshar Mahila Samoohs, Anganwadi Workers, SHG members and other stakeholders are organized at the district level in the all BBBP districts. Various training, sensitization and inter-group discussions and workshops were also organized at the State, District & Block levels for the various stakeholders.
14. Kua Pujan is a traditional ceremony for celebrating birth of boy. But in Haryana this age old ceremony is now being also observed on the birth of girl child also to bring the spirit of equality in society.

15. “Thali Bajao” ceremony were organized on the birth of girl child to promote the message of the programme and to break age-old tradition.
16. “Aapki Beti Hamari Beti” Utsavs were celebrated in all the districts of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao.
17. Haryana Diwas celebrated as Beti Diwas on 1<sup>st</sup> November.
18. 81 Mascots who have established their name in society by showing extra ordinary skills in the area of social work, cultural activities, sports and academic have been identified.
19. A Mega Event was organized on 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2015 to promote the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao: “Call to Action” initiative by the State Government, reconfirming its commitment of saving and educating its daughters. The Chief Minister of Haryana, Shri Manohar Lal, U.S. Ambassador to India, Mr. Richard Verma, Country Representative of UNICEF, Mr. Louis-Georges Arsenault, and renowned Bollywood actress, Parineeti Chopra participated in the important state-level initiative.
20. Preparation of Directories of Pregnant Women and Bulk SMS sent to 80,000 pregnant women on health and nutrition issues.
21. Organized State Level Training of Trainers for Gender Based Violence and Support Services in Partnership with PSI. Further, training programme organized at Divisional and Block Level who will in turn mobilize community on the Gender Based Violence Issues.
22. Prepared Compendium of women related scheme being implemented in various Department of Haryana.
23. Organized Sensitization Workshop at State and District Level for Govt./Semi Govt. organizations on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act.
24. Further taking into consideration Health & Hygiene Component of Women, State level Workshop for Training of Trainers of WCD, Health & Education Department organized which will trained District & Block Level functionaries for mass communication and awareness.
25. Training of Counselors were organized at Mumbai for conducting techniques related to crises intervention of women survivor under Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault.
26. Under five year of age Mortality Rate has been decreased due to increase in the Institutional Deliveries (98.5%).
27. Immunization increased to 92% in Haryana as Health Department has also introduced ROTAVIRUS Vaccine.
28. For improving the nutritional status of children a pilot project “Swasth Bachpan” has been introduced in Ambala district.

With the above efforts made by the State Govt. the sex ratio has been improved.

### iii) Monitoring of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao secretariat has been set up in the office of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana to review the implementation and monitoring of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Programme of all the Line Departments.

### 2. Anganwadi Adoption Programme – Hamari Phulwari

State Govt. has introduced a new scheme of Hamari Phulwari under Anganwadi Adoption Programme. This scheme will prove an innovative medium for the Panchayat, Municipal Councils, Individual personalities, Corporate Sector, Civil Organizations for contribution in the development of Haryana State. The aim of this scheme is to make Anganwadi Centres more attractive, child friendly and convert these Centres into modernized pattern, so that parents feel proud in sending their children to Anganwadi Centres for Non-Formal Pre-School Education and other activities related to their physical and mental development.

### **3. Haryana Kanya Kosh**

Haryana Kanya Kosh has been announced by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana on 22nd January, 2015 on the launch of BBBP programme at Panipat. The said Kosh has been constituted for the welfare and development of girls and women of Haryana. The said Kosh aims to generate an environment in which the girls are provided with the equal opportunities for their growth and empowerment. The Kosh shall be utilized to provide funds and other inputs for Apki Beti Humari Beti scheme for the welfare of the girl child and for any other initiative for the welfare and development of the girls/women. This Kanya Kosh can receive donations cash and surcharge for achievement of the objectives of the said fund. Two Committees have been formulated under the said Kosh- the State Level Governing Committee and the Executive Committee. The funds will be administered by the Women & Child Development Department. A sum of Rs. 69.40 lacs has been deposited in the Bank Account of Haryana Kanya Kosh with Bank of India. The Haryana Kanya Kosh has been registered as Society. The PAN Card of Haryana Kanya Kosh Society has been received. An appeal of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana regarding donations for Haryana Kanya Kosh Society by an individual, corporate houses and other institutions was published in the newspapers. The certificate of registration of Haryana Kanya Kosh u/s 12AA as a "Charitable Society" has been issued by Commissioner of Income Tax Department.

### **4. Aapki Beti -Hamari Beti**

In order to curb the problem of declining sex ratio a scheme named "Aapki Beti Hamari Beti Scheme" has been introduced by the present Govt. in Haryana State. The existing Ladli Scheme has been subsumed into this scheme. Under the scheme all scheduled caste and below poverty line (BPL) families whose first girl child is born on or after 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2015 shall be eligible to receive Rs. 21000/- (One Time), All families whose second girl child is born on or after 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2015, will receive Rs. 21000/- (One Time) irrespective of their caste, creed, religion, income and number of sons. This amount will be invested in group scheme Aapki Beti Hamari Beti of Life Insurance Corporation of India, Chandigarh and the matured amount of approximately Rs. 1,00,000/- will be given to the girl after completing the age of 18 years provided, she should be unmarried at that time. Haryana Govt. has extended the benefit to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Girl Child w.e.f 24-08-2015. Till now 76493 beneficiaries have been covered. A sum of Rs. 13155.00 lac is provided in the budget for the year 2017-18. Out of which a sum of Rs. 8010.75 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

## **5. Sukanya Smaruddhi Account**

Hon'ble Prime Minister of India launched the Scheme "Sukanya Smaruddhi Account" on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2015 at Panipat, on the occasion of launching of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Programme with the objective to address gender imbalance in the society and discrimination by creating a positive behaviour in favour of the girl child. The salient features of the scheme are:-

1. Addressing gender imbalance in the society- Scheme "Sukanya Smaruddhi Account" will address the gender imbalance and discrimination against girl child.
2. Age eligibility- Account can be opened from the birth of the girl child till she attains the age of 10. A girl child, who attained the age of 10 years, one year prior to notification will also be eligible.
3. Investment floor and ceiling- Account can be opened by an amount of Rs.1000/- and in a financial year investment ceiling is Rs. 1,50,000/- investments floor in a FY is Rs. 1,000/-.
4. Tax concession on investment- Exemption on investments made under the scheme will also be eligible for exemption under 80C of IT Act, 1961.
5. The interest rate given under this scheme is one of the highest rates of interest offered by Government in small savings scheme.
6. 368335 Accounts have been opened in Post Offices & Banks upto September, 2017.

## **6. One Stop Centre "Sakhi"**

One Stop Centre for Women is to provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public space under one roof and to facilitate immediate, emergency and non-emergency accesses to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counseling. One Stop Centre have been set up in the districts namely Karnal, Gurgaon, Faridabad, Hissar Rewari, Bhiwani and Narnaul. Till now 758 (women alongwith their children) cases have been dealt in the One Stop Centre. Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana has approved the setting up of One Stop Centre in all the districts of Haryana. A sum of Rs. 152.00 lac is provided in the budget for the implementation of the scheme and Rs. 60.00 lac for construction of One Stop Centre.

## **A. SCHEMES RELATED TO CHILDREN**

### **A.1 Integrated Child Development Services Scheme (ICDS)**

ICDS is a Flagship Scheme of Govt. to improve the health, nutritional, psychological and social developmental status of children of 0- 6 years and to reduce mortality, malnutrition and school dropouts. ICDS Scheme is one of the world's largest and most unique programmes for early childhood development.

At present under ICDS Scheme, there are 148 sanctioned projects (127 Rural + 21 Urban Projects) and 25962 sanctioned Anganwadi Centres including 512 Mini AWC in the State.

**(a) Objectives:-**

- i. Improve the nutritional and health status of children in the age group of 0-6 years.
- ii. Lay the foundation for proper psychological, physical and social development of the child.
- iii. Reduce the incidence of mortality, morbidity, malnutrition and school drop outs.
- iv. Achieve effective co-ordination of policy and implementation among various departments with a view to promote child development.
- v. Enhance the capability of the mother to look after the normal health and nutritional needs of the child through proper health and nutrition education.

**(b) Services:-**

Under this scheme, the following six services are provided to children (0-6 years) and pregnant and lactating women in an integrated manner:-

- i. Supplementary Nutrition
- ii. Immunization
- iii. Health Check-up
- iv. Referral Services
- v. Pre-School Education
- vi. Nutrition & Health Education

**A.1(i) Anganwadi Centres**

Haryana Govt. has taken up lot of initiative in constructing buildings of Anganwadi Centres. Presently 6433 Anganwadi Centres are running from own buildings. Anganwadi Centre is the focal point for delivery of ICDS services. Govt. of India has envisaged the Anganwadi Centre as a vibrant Early Childhood Centre (ECD). State Govt. has equipped the Anganwadi Centre with following:-

- Attractive and colourful tables and chairs (Set of 4 Tables and 16 Chairs) to 15010 Anganwadis worth Rs. 17.65 crore from state funds under ICDS scheme.
- 16875 AWCs have been provided three types of swings and 25909 Super Slide Senior with an expenditure of Rs. 14.94 crore.
- Gas Connection has been provided in 25962 Anganwadi Centers.

**A.1(ii) Supplementary Nutrition Programme**

The State Govt. is providing Supplementary Nutrition (SNP) containing an average nutritive value as per norms fixed i.e. in the case of Pregnant/Lactating mothers 600 calories and 18-20 gm. proteins, in case of children 500 calories and 12-15 gm. protein and in case of severely mal-nourished children 800 calories and 20-25 gm. protein @ Rs. 7/- per mother, Rs. 6/- per child and Rs. 9/- per mal-nourished child per day for 300 days in a year. Presently 8.93 lac children and 2.67 lac pregnant/ lactating mothers are covered under Supplementary Nutrition Programme. The recipes provided under ICDS are Poshtic Panjiri, Bharwa Parantha, Aloo puri, Meetha Chawal, Meetha Dalia, Pulao. Gulgale and Chana ,Murmura & Mungfali Mixture etc.

The expenditure of SNP is being shared by Centre & State in the ratio of 50:50.

### **Three Tier System has been adopted for procurement of SNP Items under ICDS:-**

- (a) **State Level:** Wheat and Rice under SNP are being procured from GOI under Wheat Based Nutrition Programme at subsidized rates @ Rs. 200/- per quintal & 300/- per quintal respectively. Double fortified Salt containing iron and iodine is being procured in order to eradicate anemia and malnutrition through National Small Industries Corporation, a Govt. of India Enterprise. Three types of edible oils i.e. soya oil, cotton seed oil and mustard oil are being procured through HAFED, a Haryana Govt. approved agency.
- (b) **District Level:** Other item like Pulses, Soyabean, Sugar, Chana Murmura Mixture, Besan, etc. are being procured by District Level Purchase Committee headed by ADCs.
- (c) **Village Level:** Perishable items like Vegetable, Spices etc. are being procured at village level by VLC members.

At present two Panjiri Plants, one at Gharundha (Karnal) and another one at Gurgaon are functioning in the state. These Panjiri Plants are producing 3.5 MT Panjiri per month. The Panjiri produced by these Panjiri Plants is fortified with micronutrients and is being given to the children in age group of 6 months to 18 months of Anganwadi Centres. At present these plants are producing Panjiri which caters only 14% requirements. To upgrade of these Panjiri Plants consultant has been appointed. There is proposal to set up a Panjiri Plant in district Panchkula. The Panjiri is to be given as Take Home Ration (THR) to approximately 2.6 lac children between 6-18 months of age.

#### **A.1(iv) Construction of Anganwadi Centres**

The scheme of construction of buildings of Anganwadi Centers was started in the year 2002-03 with an objective to provide clean and peace full environment to the children and Women beneficiaries of ICDS and other related schemes at village level and to create assets for them. AWC is not merely an AWC but a focal point for village women where they can feel themselves free and can discuss freely issues related to women & child. At present cost of construction of an Anganwari is Rs. 9.95 lac. Construction work is being executed by Panchayati Raj Department under the overall supervision of Additional Deputy Commissioner who is the Nodal Officer of the scheme at district level.



The state Govt has also increased the resources for the construction of Anganwadi Buildings by taking NABARD Assisted Project, RIDF worth Rs. 224.00 crore for the construction of 2533 Anganwadi buildings. Since 2002-03, the State Govt. has spent Rs. 55459.00 lacs for the construction of 6343 Anganwadi Buildings till 2017-18 including GOI share of Rs.2531.25 lac.

### **A.1(v) Training of ICDS Functionaries**

The training of ICDS functionaries is a continuous process and for imparting training, a total of 10 Anganwadi Workers Training Centers are functioning in the state out of which 8 Centers are being run by Haryana Council for Child Welfare and 2 Training Centres at Radaur by Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust. One Middle Level Training Centre for ICDS Supervisors is also being run through Women's Awareness & Management Academy Rai, Distt. Sonipat.

In addition to this State Plans for Training (STRAP) of ICDS functionaries are prepared and submitted to Govt. of India every year. Grant-in-Aid received from Govt. of India under UDISHA have been further released to Haryana State Council for Child Welfare, Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust, Radaur and Middle Level Training Centre, WAMA RAI (Sonipat). During the year 2017-18, 265 Supervisor have been imparted refresher training in MLTC, Rai (Sonipat) and 3900 AWW & 3360 AWHs have attended Refresher Training Course in Anganwadi Training Centres.

### **A.2 Scheme of Improving Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices.**

To reduce malnutrition among children, the scheme of Improving Infant and Young Child Feeding has been started in the year 2005-06. Anganwadi Workers were trained through Master Trainers to equip them with knowledge and skill of Improving Infant and Young Child Feeding to enable them to create awareness and counseling of mothers more effectively. In addition to this funds were also spent on publicity on breastfeeding etc. A sum of Rs. 16.00 lac has been provide in the budget for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 5.26 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

### **A.3 Haryana State Commission for Protection of Child Rights**

Haryana State Commission for Protection of Child Rights is also functional in the state with its Headquarter at Panchkula. All the six members and Chairperson of the commission have been appointed. Member of the commission has inspected the 1142 buses of schools of 21 districts as per order of Hon'ble High Court, Haryana under Surkshit School Vahan Policy. A sum of Rs. 60.00 lac has been provide in the budget for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 15.00 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

### **A.4 Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS)**

Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) is an umbrella scheme under which various schemes for children in need of care and protection, and children in conflict with law are covered. The programme is being implementing through Haryana State Child Protection Society (HSCPS). The children in need of care and protection are being provided Institutional as well as Non Institutional Care under the scheme. For providing non Institutional Care State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) has been set up at State level.

At the district level the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) and District Child Protection Committee under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner has been constituted. The Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) is mainly an instrument to implement the provisions of J.J. Act, 2000 which has been amended as Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 and came into force w.e.f. 15.01.2016. The State has created a Juvenile Justice Fund for providing facilities to the juveniles.

Child Welfare Committees (CWC) and Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) have been set up in all districts for the effective implementation of Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act 2015.

#### **A.4(i) Two Broad Categories of Children under ICPS**

##### **1. Children in Conflict with Law**

As per the section 48 of Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act 2015, the Children in Conflict with Law committed by JJBs who requires long term rehabilitation and protection are sent to the Special Homes. Currently, the state of Haryana has four Observation Homes (Ambala, Hisar, Faridabad (for Boys) and Karnal (for Girls) and one Special Home (for Boys at Sonipat).

##### **2. Children in Need of Care and Protection**

Under the broad spectrum of Children in Need of Care and Protection, the state of Haryana has 72 Child Care Institutions (being runs by Govt, Semi Govt. and Private Organizations) for care, protection, treatment, development and rehabilitation of the children. The CCIs are spread all across the 21 districts of Haryana and cover approximately 4,000 children. The children in need of care and Protection are taken care of by Child Welfare Committees (CWC) which is the competent authority to deal with the cases of Children in Need of Care and Protection.

#### **A.4(ii) Services provided through Integrated Child Protection Scheme**

##### **I. Institutional Services**

For care, protection, treatment, development and rehabilitation of the children in need of care and protection, there are 72 Child Care Institutions (govt., semi govt. and private) in Haryana State. Under ICPS, for maintenance of children Rs. 2000/- per child per month (food Rs. 1400/- and Rs. 600/- for clothing, medicine, soap, oil etc and Rs. 800/- per child/per year for bedding is being provided to the children. Further, in Govt. institutions additional Rs. 1000/- per child per month is provided by State Govt. Other facilities like educational, medical, vocational and recreational etc are being providing to the children residing in these Child Care Institutions.

- **Open Shelter Homes**

Open Shelter caters to the children particularly beggars, child sexual substances, street and working children etc. these homes are not meant to provide permanent residential facilities for children but compliments the existing institutional care facilities. Presentably in Haryana 25 Open Shelter (16 Haryana State Council For Child Welfare run and 9 are NGO run) Homes running in various districts.

## **II. Non Institutional Services**

Adoption is a process through which a child who is permanently separated from biological parents because his/her parents have died, or have abandoned or surrendered her/him, becomes legitimate child of a new set of parents referred to as Adoptive Parents with all rights, privileges and responsibilities that are attached to this relationship. If any orphan or abandoned child without family support received by anyone, is to be reported immediately either to the office In-charge of the nearest Police Station or the Child Welfare Committee or Child line or Specialized Adoption Agency of that area. About 203 children have been placed for in country and inter country adoption. Similarly 1820 children have been benefited under Sponsorship and Foster Care and an amount of Rs. 3.14 crore has been utilized.

### **A.4 (iii) Security Mechanisms in Child Care Institutions (CCIs)**

#### **1. Mapping of Child Care Institutions**

After the mapping of all Child Care Institutions in year 2012, registration of Child Care Institutions under Section 41 (1) of new JJ Act, 2015 was made mandatory. Presently in Haryana, there are 72 Child Care Institutions, out of which 8 are run by Govt., 6 by semi Govt. and 58 by private organizations.

#### **2. Registration of Child Care Institutions**

Those Child Care Institutions which are recommended for registration by the District Administration have been issued Provisional Registration valid for six month and thereafter, with due procedure, Regular Registration Certificate is given, which will be valid for five years. Accordingly, out of 72 Child care Institutions, 44 Child Care Institutions are registered under Section 41 (1) of Juvenile Justice Act 2015. Registration of 28 Child Care Institutions are under process.

#### **3. Monitoring and Supervision of Child Care Institutions**

State and District Level Inspection Committees, have also been notified on 27-07-2012 for periodical inspections and reporting.

#### 4. Training and Awareness Generation

Various training programmes have been conducted by NIPCCD, New Delhi and the State Head Quarter to train the chairpersons and members of Juveniles Justice Board, Child Welfare Committees, DCPS Functionaries, ICPS Functionaries and Officials from Child Care Institutions (CCIs). Detail of Training Programmes organized from the year 2012 to 2017 is as below.

## **B) SCHEME RELATED TO ADOLESCENT GIRLS**

### **B.1 Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls (SABLA)**

A centrally sponsored Scheme Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls 'SABLA' was formally launched by State Govt. in March, 2011 on pilot basis in six districts of Haryana State i.e. Hissar, Ambala, Rohtak, Rewari, Yamuna Nagar and Kaithal.

#### **(a) Objectives of the scheme are:**

- Enable the Adolescent Girls for self-development
- Improve their nutrition and health status.
- Promote awareness about health, hygiene, nutrition, Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH) and family & child care.
- Upgrade their home-based skills and vocational skills
- Provide information/guidance about access to education/learning, existing public services such as PHC, CHC, Post office, Bank, Police Station etc.

#### **(b) SERVICES:**

An integrated package of following services is provided to the girls: -

- i. Nutrition** – Supplementary nutrition is provided to all out of school girls in the age group of 11-18 years and school going 11-14 years girls @ Rs. 5/- per day per beneficiary for 300 days in a year.
- ii. Iron and Folic Acid (IFA) supplementation** – The IFA supplementation is provided to out of school girls with convergence of Health Department.
- iii. Health check-up and Referral services** – General health check-up of all out of school girls is conducted at least once in three months on Kishori Diwas.
- iv. Nutrition & Health Education (NHED)** – It is given to all adolescent girls in the Anganwadi Centres jointly by the ICDS, Health Functionaries and Resource Persons.
- v. Counseling/Guidance on family welfare, ARSH, child care practices and home management** - This is provided at the Anganwadi centre by the resource persons from NGOs with the help of Anganwadi workers.
- vi. Life Skill Education and accessing public services** - Awareness talks and visits are arranged in collaboration with PRI members, police personnel, bank officials, post officials, health functionaries etc. Information/guidance about entry/re-entry into formal schools and motivation to do the same is also provided in coordination with Education Department.
- vii. Vocational training** – This is provided to girls aged 16 years and above under National Skill Development Program (NSDP) for orientation towards self employment after 18 years of age.

**(c) Beneficiaries: Adolescent Girls 11-18 years**

- **Nutrition** – 176897 adolescent girls of 11-14 years (out of school) and 14-18 years all girls (school going and out of school) have been targeted for providing supplementary nutrition @ of Rs. 5 per beneficiary per day for 300 days in a year.
- **Non-Nutrition** – 308983 adolescent girls have been targeted to be covered under this component.

**(d) Budget Provision and expenditure:**

A sum of Rs. 1170.00 lac has been provided in the budget for the year 2017-18.

**B.2 Kishori Shakti Yojna**

Kishori Shakti Yojna is being implemented in 87 ICDS projects for improving the health and nutritional status of adolescent girls in the age group of 11-18 years and to train and equip them to improve home based and vocational skills and to promote awareness of health, hygiene, nutrition, home management, child care etc.

Services under the scheme are provided through formation of Balika Mandals for six months in 10% of the Anganwadi Centres. 27248 girls are being provided Supplementary Nutrition and 27991 Vocational training upto September, 2017. At present 1484 Balika Mandals have been formed. The girls are also provided supplementary nutrition @ Rs 5.00 per girl per day. A sum of Rs. 474.50 lac has been provided in the budget for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 135.75 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

**C) SCHEMES RELATED TO WOMEN**

**C.1 Haryana State Commission for Women**

Haryana State Commission for Women has been strengthened by giving it statutory status. Now the Haryana State Commission for Women Act- 2012 is in operation and have the powers of civil court to investigate/examine all matters relating to women and for summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person, requiring the discovery and production of any document, requisitioning any public record from any public office. A sum of Rs 70.00 lac has been provide in the budget for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 26.00 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

**C.2 Scheme for Relief and Rehabilitation of Women Acid Victims.**

Haryana Government is implementing a scheme for Relief and Rehabilitation of Women Acid Victims under which the assistance is provided to the victims of acid attack, who are residents of Haryana and have become victims of acid attack in Haryana.

Under the scheme victims is entitle to receive free of cost 100% medical treatment from the Govt./Govt. approved hospitals. This amount will be reimbursed by the WCD Department. Under the Scheme adhoc relief of Rs. 1.00 lac, is provided to the acid attack victim. Till now a sum of Rs. 43.34 lac have been given 13 Women Acid Victims. A sum of Rs. 30.00 lac has been provide for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 5.41 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

### **C.3 Protection of Women from Domestic Violence**

The State Govt. has taken a unique initiative by appointing 21 Protection-cum-Child Marriage Prohibition Officers (PPOs) at district level. To implement the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 and Prohibition of Child Marriage Act-2006. The office of Protection-cum-Child Marriage Prohibition Officers has been set up in the premises of Mahila Police Station for effective implementation of the Act. 30 service providers like Haryana State Social Welfare Board, District Red Cross Societies and District Child Welfare Councils have been selected for providing necessary assistance to the aggrieved persons in the State. All Govt. Hospitals, PHCs and CHCs have been notified for medical facility and three Shelter Homes have also been notified for providing shelters to the needy women under this Act. The physical progress upto August, 2017 is as under:-

A sum of Rs. 150.00 lac has been provided in the budget for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 38.57 lac has been spent upto September, 2017.

### **C.4 Protection of Women from Sexual Harassment at Workplace**

State Govt. is committed to provide protection of women from sexual harassment at work place and their right to work with dignity. For this purpose, the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition & redressal) Act, 2013 is being enforced. All the Government Departments, Boards Corporations and Commissions have been directed to constitute ICC in their respective departments. All DCs have been notified as district officers under the said Act. Local Complaints Committee have constituted in all the districts. Similar Committees are being constituted in Private Organizations employing ten women. Two State Level Workshop, one for the members of Govt. Departments and another for Boards/Corporations/Commissions on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2013 in collaboration with NGO- Prevention of Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse (POSHCA), New Delhi were organized on 10.11.2016 and 06.02.2017 at Chandigarh.

### **C.5 Working Women Hostel**

Working Women Hostels are functioning in the State to provide availability of safe and convenient accommodation to working women located near their working place with Day Care facility for their children (girls upto the age of 18 years and boys upto the age of 5 years accompanying working mother) wherever possible, in urban, semi urban, or even rural areas. Working Women, who may be single, widow, divorced, separated, married whose husband or immediate family does not reside in the same city as well as women who are under training for more than 1 year are eligible.



Government of India has sanctioned 20 Working Women Hostels in the State out of which 10 are running at Panchkula, Kurukshetra, Jind, Sirsa, Faridabad, Rohtak (2), and Hisar (3). A sum of Rs. 5.00 lac has been provided in the budget for the year 2017-18.

#### **C.6 Widows and Destitute Homes (Mahila Ashram)**

The department is running Homes for widows and destitute women at Karnal and Rohtak, to provide accommodation, maintenance and clothing allowance, education and training to the young widows and destitute women for their rehabilitation. At present 83 families along with 75 dependents are residing in these Homes as per detail given below:-

A sum of Rs. 209.00 lac has been provided for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 80.82 lac has been spent up to September, 2017.

#### **C.7 State After Care Home for Girls, Karnal (Nari Niketan)**

Revised guidelines have been formulated to operate “The Haryana State After Care Home for Girls (Nari Niketan) and reconstitution of District Advisory Committee.” The aim of these guidelines is to regulate the administration of the State After Care Home for Girls (Nari Niketan) in order to provide institutional care, protection, social security, maintenance, education and training to such girls/women who have no means of subsistence or have been rescued from moral danger or are exposed to moral danger with a view to make them self-reliant and become ultimately useful members of the society. The inmates are provided free boarding, lodging, clothing, education, training and medical facilities and efforts are made to rehabilitate them. Training in different trades like stitching, embroidery, knitting etc. have been arranged for the inmates through voluntary agencies. At present 61 inmates are residing in the Home against the Capacity of 65. Every woman/girl after her admission got medically examined from a competent Medical Officer and the report on her condition are safely kept in the institution.

An Advisory Committee at District Level under the Chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner has been constituted to guide the administration of the institution on various matters.

A sum of Rs. 55.00 lac has been provide for the year 2017-18, out of which a sum of Rs. 24.28 lac has been spent up to September, 2017.

### **C.8 Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY)**

Under this scheme pregnant and lactating mothers are being paid Rs. 5000/- in three installments per pregnant & lactating women. First installment (in early registration of pregnancy), second installment (after 6 month of pregnancy) and third installment (at child birth registration) paid to the beneficiaries on fulfilling specific condition related to maternal and child health to partly compensate for wage loss to mothers / women during pregnancy and period of lactation. The Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) is approved by Govt. of India to be implemented in all the districts of Haryana w.e.f. 01.01.2017. A sum of Rs. 2450.00 lac is provided in the budget for the year 2017-18.

### **C.10 State Resource Centre for Women**

State Resource Centre for Women mandate to give focused attention to inter sectoral issues affecting women by undertaking research, maintaining gender related data & engage in training & capacity building programmes to enable greater understanding on women issues especially bringing the discourse on women belonging to vulnerable and marginalized communities on the forefront.

The State Resource Centre for Women in consultation with key stakeholders will prepare State Action Plans with a focus on women's issues and provide technical support and coordination for implementation of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme, facilitate the implementation of Purna Shakti Kendra and Village Convergence Facilitation Services. The scheme is implemented on sharing basis i.e. 60:40 (Centre Share). All Staff under State Resource Centre for Women has been appointed.

### **C.11 Sports Meet for Rural Women**

As far as sports activities are concerned apart from few opportunities available at schools/colleges, rural women are hardly exposed to sports and recreation. Hence, the scheme of Sports Meet for Rural Women was started during the year 2005-06. Sports Meets Scheme has been modified by dividing all events into two age groups. Sports events are included Potato Race, Matka Race and 100 Meter Race for the women above the age of 30 years while 300 Meter Race, 400 Meter Race and 5 KMs Cycle Race for the girls/women below the age of 30 years. The Sports Meet of Rural Women are organized at block level, district level and state level. The women who attain 1<sup>st</sup> position in various events organized at district level participated in the State Level Sports Meet. The women securing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> position at block level are given awards @ Rs. 2100/-, Rs. 1100/- and Rs. 750/- and at district level and state level are given @ Rs. 4100/-, Rs. 3100/- & Rs. 2100/- and Rs. 11000/-, Rs. 8100/- & Rs. 4100/- respectively. Rs. 1000/- is given to all the participant on the State Level Sports Meet.

## **D) SCHEME RELATED TO AWARDS**

### **D.1 State Level Awards for Women.**

The State Level Women Awards are given on the occasion of international Women Day every year i.e. 8<sup>th</sup> March. These awards are given to the women achievers who have done outstanding work in different fields so that they become role models for future generation of India Women. The detail of Awards is as under:-

### **D.2 Incentive Awards for Improvement in Sex Ratio.**

The districts showing improvement in declining Sex Ratio and securing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> positions in the State are given Sex Ratio Awards at district level every year to the tune of Rs. 5.00 lac, Rs. 3.00 lac & Rs. 2.00 lac respectively. A sum of Rs. 10.00 lac has been provided in the budget for the year 2017-18.

### **D.3 Nutrition Award for Improvement in Nutritional Status.**

Nutrition Awards were started from the year 2006-07 to motivate the people and to give recognition to the districts who have brought improvements in the nutrition and health status of children. Nutrition Awards are given to three best districts who have shown maximum improvement in nutritional status of children below 6 years. The first prize of Rs. 2.00 lac, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize of Rs.1.00 lac and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize of Rs. 50,000 are given for obtaining first, second and third position respectively.

### **D.4 Best Mother Award**

To encourage women for proper rearing of their children, especially the girl child with a view to improve their nutritional and health status, the scheme of Best Mother Award has been started from the year 2005-06. From the year 2016-17 the present Govt. has enhanced the prize money four times and also enhanced the function money. Under this scheme from each circle and each block of ICDS scheme, 3 mothers having at least one girl child are selected for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes, @ Rs. 4000/- Rs. 3000/- and Rs. 2000/- respectively at block level and Rs. 2000/-, Rs. 1200/- and Rs. 800/- at the circle level.

#### **D.5 Adolescent Girls Award Scheme, Haryana**

In order to encourage rural girls for pursuing higher education, Adolescent Girls Awards Scheme, Haryana is being implemented under which 3 girls who stands 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in their Senior Secondary Examination and Matriculation Examination conducted by Haryana State Education Board from schools in rural areas from each block are given awards. Now, the State Govt. has revised the award money as under:-

#### **E. Schemes related to Swaran Jayanti Year 2016-17**

Five new schemes related to women and children has been approved by the Hon'ble CM, Haryana for Swaran Jayanti Year 2016-17. The details of schemes are as under:-

##### **i. Swaran Jayanti Bal Aahar Utpadan Kendra**

A consultant has been appointed to upgrade the presently functioning / working two Panjiri Plants one at Gharunda and one at Gurgaon with the aim to provide Panjiri with micronutrients to the children in the age group of 6 months to 3 years.

##### **ii. Nari Ashrya Avam Kaushal Kunj**

A Nari Ashrya Avam Kaushal Kunj with the capacity of 50 inmates is being set up in Kasturba Sewa Sadan building in district Faridabad to provide Institutional care, protection, social security, maintenance, education and training to the girls/women.

##### **iii. Swarna Jayanti Bal Sudhar Greh**

To provide residential care and protection during pendency of any inquiry, a New Bal Sudhar Greh is being set up in the Kasturba Sewa Sadan building in district Faridabad for the Children in conflict with law who enter the Juvenile Justice System through Juvenile Justice Board (JJB).

##### **iv. Swarna Jayanti Puruskar Yojna for Women**

With the aim to encourage women for outstanding work done in different fields, a scheme Swarna Jayanti Puruskar Yojna for Women has been approved in the state.

##### **v. Swarna Jayanti Swasth Bachpan (Pilot Scheme)**

With the aim to improve the Nutritional Status of severely malnourished children, a special scheme will be started under which health measurement will be improved after identity the children by counseling Age & Height (Mid Upper Arm Circumference) along with weight. Under the scheme health and nutrition education will be provided to the parents of children with the coordination of Health Deptt.
